The day is fixed to do work as a spiritual guide on monthly Ekadashi. Students are communicated with pilgrims and provide very important historical and spritual information to the pilgrims in scientific view. This practices helps students to enhance their courage, feeling of co-operation, communication skills and over all personality development. This practice made the impact on students social and educational development. The role of the faculty is the role of facilitator and that allows for greater dialogue with each individual student.

5) Evidence of Success-

The practice has very big role in progression of the student. It enhance their experiencial work in higher education. It has carried the students, stakeholders' communication development. It spreads the scientific view among the pilgrims. The practice has provided a new direction to the students to get prepare personal and social development.

This practice will be fruitful in future. The practice has improved to communicate rural people and to give them scientific view through higher education.

The practice has contributed to create social commitment and national integrity. This innovative practice has given new direction about student's personal and social development through higher education. It has taught how to face challenges in life.

6) Problems Encountered and Resources Required -
